

HISTORY OF AFGHANISTAN



The many decades of war in Afghanistan have eroded much of the social and physical infrastructure. Thousands of men, women and children were killed or displaced, the

economy virtually collapsed, education institutions were closed, and the country's political and governmental structures disintegrated.



Most development programs initiated by the governments prior to the war came to a halt. Women and children suffer most due to the war. The number of orphans and widows is high and the need for rehabilitation is great. Traditionally Afghan women rely upon their male relatives for livelihood. Afghan custom and culture have given a distinct position to women in Afghan society that often confines them to the four walls of their homes and opportunities to take part in productive activities outside are very limited. The vast majority of women, including war widows, female headed households and orphans now depend on external support for survival.



Much of the middle generation lacks the necessary skills to lead and manage. They are often content to do what they have always done and are unaware of the possibility of a greater and more prosperous Afghanistan. A great need has risen to rebuild the nation's physical and socio-economic infrastructure.



The country has seen over three decades of war and has finally come to a time and place where this freedom and reconstruction is possible.

By rebuilding the nation's infrastructure we create better livelihoods in many sectors of society: communication, transportation, health care, business development, agriculture, trade, and others. Through employment of the Afghans we are able to build capacity into the nation and instill trade skills that will help to provide economic stability and support for their families.



The current situation necessitates the intervention from the aid community for short and long term reconstruction work in Afghanistan. 

We can also minimize the adverse effects of those unfortunate events and disputes, which inevitably do occur. All construction endeavors require the continuous management of massive amounts of

information, which must be generated, reviewed, distributed, retained, and retrieved as quickly and efficiently as possible. **AWC** offers computerized scheduling, estimating, data management, system integration and process optimization reviews for construction projects. To control project time and cost, we have developed sophisticated project monitoring techniques which capture the right kinds of information for integration with estimate, schedule and cost data to create meaningful measurement of actual progress against the established budget and schedule. Ahmad Wali Construction Company is a highly qualified team that stands ready to meet any customer's needs.

QUALITY CONTROL/ Safety

AWC is committed to apply sound safety programs and to provide a safe and healthy work environment. AWC adhere to the requirements applicable to the project. This program coordinates with proper insurance standards and practices for the region. Local governmental safety rules and regulations, if deemed more stringent than contractually invoked regulations complied with. No person is required or instructed to work in surroundings



or under conditions that do not possess a certain level of safety standards or that are dangerous to his or her health.

The Safety Officer is responsible for the safety program implementation. He will have authority to stop or change work methods to comply with safety regulations and to shutdown the work in those areas in which there is evident:

1. A threat to life or serious injury.
2. Repeated refusal to comply with safety regulations.
3. As directed by authorized government representatives.

The Safety Officer attends preparatory phase inspections to insure and communicate with the necessary safe work practices to be utilized by AWC employees, and by any subcontractor personnel, if used. The Activity Hazard Analysis (APP) is used to assist in this discussion and is prepared and updated as necessary to reflect the steps to be used for each activity or phase of work.

The Safety Officer attends and conduct an initial inspection to monitor compliance with the applicable safety regulations and the APP. Departures is documented on the daily safety report. This information will include:

Particular phase of work, including APP

Date

Time

Physical location

Name of workers and foreman performing the work

Departure(s), if any

Corrective action needed or to be taken

Whether corrective action has been completed

Name of safety individual making the report

Safety personnel conducts follow-up inspections to monitor compliance with applicable safety regulations and the APP. Departures will be documented on the daily safety report in a manner similar to initial inspection as stated above.

Accident Prevention Responsibility

The Safety Officer will be responsible to ensure that all work proceeds according to this accident prevention plan.

The Supervisors will be responsible to insure that all work proceeds according to this accident prevention plan.

Supervisors will be provided a copy of the approved accident prevention plan, the applicable APP, and shall be directly responsible for the enforcement of the same.

All foreman and Supervisory personnel will be advised of the nature and the extent of their accident prevention and housekeeping responsibilities. Each permanent employee will be indoctrinated in general project safety measures. It will be stressed to each person that the primary purpose of the program is the prevention of unsafe practices and unsafe conditions occurring, rather than the correction of deficiencies after they have occurred. Only when such preventative measures become habitual will we have reached our goal to achieve a safe work environment so that each individual can rest with peace of mind at the safety standards provided and the produce being the positive health each person enjoys.

Any safety deficiency reported by government representatives will be corrected immediately.

Safety office personnel will make periodic checks to ensure that deficiencies will not occur.

Accident Reporting

Accidents requiring hospitalization will be verbally reported within 24 hours to the Corps of Engineers representatives. Each accident or fire will be thoroughly investigated by the foreman under whose supervision it occurs. He will then report to the Supervisor and complete preparation of reports of injury, damage, or fires.

All lost time injuries are to be reported on the forms and in the manner prescribed by the Corps of Engineers representatives not later than 24 hours after the accident, giving a completed description of what happened and remedial action taken to prevent recurrence. All property damages exceeding \$100.00 on all fires will be reported to the Corps of Engineers representatives within 24 hours. Man-hours will be kept by monthly period. Reports shall be furnished upon request.

Additionally, an accident with any of the consequences listed below shall be immediately reported to the authorized representative: these accidents will be investigated in depth to identify all causes and to recommend hazard control measures:

fatal injury 3 or more persons admitted to a hospital

Property Damage meeting minimum amount requirements

Copies of all medical treatment reports, including first aid and injury reports, even if otherwise not reportable, shall be maintained on file and will be provided to the government's authorized representative upon request.

An alarm horn will be provided and maintained within easy hearing distance for all personnel in the area.

AWC, in conjunction with the project design consultants, implements sophisticated quality control procedures at every stage of project. We have full time specialists writing specifications, estimating costs, and scheduling the project. This practice ensures continuity and consistency from project to project. We employ a full-time specialist in quality control and safety who is involved in construction document/plan review through the design and construction phases. This practice provides construction



administration personnel with a thorough knowledge of the project early in the process. Our practice group, composed of all technical staff, superintendents, quality control personnel and project managers, meets monthly to share experiences, to formulate standards for production, and to address critical issues.

Before we undertake any project we make sure that we fully understand the specifications and requirements our customers require.

During each project, materials are tested regularly to verify consistency and quality. We have rigorous testing standards that go beyond the normal material manufacturer requirements. COST CONTROL

AWC has developed a construction cost estimating system that is the result of years of construction and cost control experience. As the design progresses, our team works with the architect to prepare detailed estimates of construction costs based on take-offs of actual material quantities, input from various technical consultants, and examination of current market prices. Our process gives the Owner the opportunity to have design documents that are developed in accordance with the Owner's budget. Our firm's proven ability to monitor cost and to provide critical value-analysis recommendations has gained **AWC** an industry-wide reputation of being able to deliver projects on time and within budget.



BUDGET

AWC establishes a price/budget for the project before the first dollar is spent for construction and submits a line-item cost analysis to the Owner prior to construction.

DOCUMENT PREPARATION

Once a project is approved, final construction documents are prepared. Our team works jointly with the representatives of the Owner and the Architect to ensure that the final design represents the Owner's detailed requirements.

Under our team system, construction documents are produced by the same people involved in the design review and by the project managers who will build them. This continuity of staff ensures that all requirements are incorporated into the drawings and construction.

CONTRACT ADMINISTRATION

AWC administers the Owner's contracts and produces a monthly status report, which summarizes monthly financial activities.

PROJECT SUPERVISION

AWC employs a full-time, on-site project superintendent, a project engineer, and other staff, as the project requires. The project superintendent's field office is staffed as necessary to ensure quality, to control cost, and to manage on-time completion of the project.

Design and build

The Design Build approach is a comprehensive construction service system that brings the design and construction firms together in a focused relationship offering Owners a single source of responsibility.
